

District Government continues to operate in a modified telework posture.



Department of Parks and Recreation

Beginning today, Friday, May 29, athletic fields, gated parks, dog parks, tennis courts, and **skate parks** will start to re-open.

Contact sports and groups of more than 10 people remain prohibited.









Department of Motor Vehicles

On Tuesday, June 2, the Southwest Service Center will be open by appointment only for resident access to three services:

- First-time/conversion DC license/ID card (including learner permit)
- First-time/conversion DC vehicle titling/registration
- Knowledge test

There will be no vehicle inspection or road tests offered at this time.

REIMAGINING PUBLIC SPACE FOR RESTAURANTS, RETAIL, AND RECREATION

20 IS PLENTY

The default speed limit on local roads will be 20 miles per hour.



Recreation: Slow Streets

Slows streets will support neighborhood-based social distancing by **limiting through traffic** and **lowering speeds** in areas with heavy foot and bicycle traffic.

Identified roads will be limited to local traffic only, meaning destinations within two blocks, and the speed limit will be set at 15 mph.



Open Space: Restaurants & Retail

Restaurants that are not already permitted for outdoor space or that want to expand their outdoor space

Retailers may apply for space for curbside pickup

Outdoor Dining

WHAT TO KNOW

- Wear a mask (not required to wear while eating or drinking)
- All diners must be seated
- No more than six people at a table
- Tables must be six feet apart
- Games and other activities that lead to close contact are prohibited

What's Open?

- Patio seating
- Rooftop seating
- Summer gardens

Alcohol can only be sold (except for grab and go or delivery) or consumed on-site between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and midnight.
